Preaching Is At The Heart Of What We Do...


Over this past year we have been in our sermon series, Acts; Can I Get a Witness?, and that is because at HCC we have committed to expository preaching. We started the year in chapter 4 witnessing a church had all things in common, living in peace harmony. We landed in chapter 17 where we have been learning how to endure through struggles along with the Apostle Paul and the new Gentile churches. It just so happens, by God's Providence, we are using Paul's Sermon on "Knowing the Unknown God" as our Advent theme celebrating the Incarnation of Christ so He could be known!

We are currently 2/3 of the way done and we are on pace to finish Acts by the end of 2024. This is a great resource to share with friends and family if they want to learn what it means to be a part of a church, to be more evangelistic, and to live with a realization that we are to be different than the rest of the world.

Then in October, back by popular demand, we visited the The Five Solas of the Reformation. Yes, we had gone through them before but in light of our culture trying to deconstruct the Truth of God's Word at every chance it gets, we decided to go on the offensive. We went back to the book of Genesis and showed everyone that the War Cries of the Reformation have been with us from the very beginning. In this way we sought to help the body learn that the major truths that we hold to about the Doctrines of Grace have been with us for thousands of years, showing that they are as unchanging as God Himself. This is a good series to share with someone who may be struggling coming to terms with Calvinism and it offers a way to introduce these concepts in a non-threatening manner.

It Starts With A Firm Foundation

Foundations is our Sunday-school format, focused on teaching the doctrines of the Christian faith. Our Sunday School classes cover Elementary, 6th through 12th grade, and adult classes. Last year, Pastor Onan Coca, alongside his wife Leah, accepted the challenge and spearheaded the development of our elementary and student curriculum program, which implements lessons based on the Baptist Catechism. We have also committed to having male leadership in each class, lead by our Pastors, which allows more people across the congregation to build and grow direct relationships with our leaders.

In 2023, we continued catechizing students across all age groups, from elementary through middle school to adults, using the Baptist Catechism. It has been enriching to see not only our younger children but also our middle schoolers and adults deeply engage with God's Word. They have been memorizing Scripture, participating in worship, and delving into understanding the 'why' behind our beliefs. Currently, we are about 85 weeks into our catechism journey, with approximately 50 weeks remaining before we start anew.

We encourage you to invite families with children of all ages, particularly those in elementary (K-5) and middle school, to join our church. This way, their children too can be immersed in the knowledge of Scripture. Teaching our diverse group of students is immensely rewarding and provides a wonderful chance to connect with and cherish every member of our Highlands community.




As part of our ongoing commitment to our core value of education, we emphasize the daily discipline of Bible reading. While we could invest considerable time and effort in various programs and ministries, their true value only emerges when we ground ourselves in God's Word. We rely on Scripture alone to shape our minds and hearts, as we grow together in knowledge of our God. The **"To The Word**" Bible reading plan (developed by Christ Church of Moscow, Idaho) offers an extraordinary opportunity to read through the entire Bible from September through May. Then, the **"Same Page Summer"** reading plan takes you through the New Testament throughout the summer. If you haven't already, we earnestly invite you to join us in this daily journey through the Word. Experience your love for God grow as you engage in this devotional discipline with your church family.

This past year, Pastor Mike also conducted a course called "Fundamentals of Faith," consisting of 13 intensive lessons that delve into the basics of Christian faith from a reformed perspective. We will be offering this course again, starting in the winter. If you're interested in becoming a member or gaining a better understanding of your theology, this class is tailored for you.

In addition to our Bible reading plan and Fundamentals class, we have made diligent efforts to foster discipleship within same-sex groups. For the men, we organized monthly men's breakfasts, sponsored by Pastor Bill, while for the ladies, Leah Coca hosted similar gatherings. Prior to each meeting, we carefully selected material to address the specific needs of the men and women in our congregation...



Memorable Gatherings



Peñas Blancas Mission Trip

In October 2022, we sent Rolando along with Pastor Keith from New Georgia Baptist Church to visit Penas Blancas, initiating what we hope will be a longterm partnership with the <u>West Metro Baptist Association</u>. This collaboration aims to reach some unreached people groups along the Ecuadorian coast. This year, we managed to send both Brother Rolando and Pastor Jody as part of a four-member team. We raised these funds outside our normal budget to start determining how we can better serve the people of Peñas Blancas.

This endeavor proved to be an incredible experience for our church. It allowed us to learn the names of the local people, hear their stories, and begin to pray specifically for their needs. We are exploring ways to meet these needs effectively.

Our mission team spent a total of seven days working in a local school, undertaking needed renovations while also engaging with and sharing the gospel among the local population. During their stay, they successfully repaired and rebuilt a roof on an old portable school building, providing muchneeded space for the school's expansion. Additionally, the team hired a welder and enlisted local assistance, forging valuable relationships for future projects

They also managed to repair the school's cistern, essential for water collection, and conducted minor home improvements for some of the teachers. Fortunately, the team had the opportunity to immerse themselves in the local culture, share the gospel, interact with the local fire department, and share their testimonies about Jesus.

This trip marked a fantastic beginning to what our team hopes will be a more extensive effort, and they pray that many others will have the chance to be a part of this experience in the future.

Summer Lunch Program – This year's Summer Lunch Program concluded with a record-breaking 25,453 lunches delivered! So, What Lays Ahead?

Each year, the Elders of our church prayerfully anticipate the coming year, striving to honor God by identifying key areas where we foresee change and growth. As we move into the next year, here are three primary areas of focus:

Plans & Goals for Education

Our Elder team has diligently prayed over various aspects of our church's ministry this year, and we feel a divine calling to revise our liturgy. Liturgy, which simply means "the work of the people" or "acts of worship" in a church context, refers to the order of service. This led us to ponder, "What constitutes a biblical order of service?"

The Second London Baptist Confession 22.1 states:

"The acceptable way of worshipping the true God is instituted by Himself and so limited by His own revealed will, that He may not be worshipped according to the imaginations and devices of men, nor the suggestions of Satan, under any visible representations, or any other way not prescribed in the Holy Scriptures."

This concept, known as "the Regulative Principle of Worship," restricts the elements of public worship to preaching and reading the Word, the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper, prayer, singing Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, and whatever else Scripture commands (LBCF 22.5).

We believe that the Bible provides clear instructions for worship, meaning our practices should be scripturally guided. Furthermore, we uphold that every congregation member should participate in all worship aspects – it's not solely the Pastor's responsibility. Thus, prayer, scripture reading, singing, and listening to the preached Word are duties of each congregant.

With this perspective, Highlands Community Church will welcome the New Year with a refreshed liturgy, aiming to honor God and edify the body in every aspect of our Sunday worship.

Post New Year's, we will review our sermon calendar to select our next book for study, possibly one of Paul's Epistles. We are also planning to offer a Fundamentals class in the winter for new members and those seeking theological strengthening.

Our church is enhancing fellowship and spiritual growth through dedicated same-sex groups, growing community groups, service opportunities, and a family discipleship program designed to deepen faith and community bonds.

Men's and Women's Groups – Our church recognizes the importance of fostering strong bonds within gender-specific groups, where members can share and grow in their faith through more personalized discussions and activities. Plans for the upcoming year include continued investment in our men's and women's fellowship groups. These groups will continue to provide a safe and open environment for discussing challenges and topics specific to each gender from a biblical perspective. The men's group might focus on leadership roles within the family and community, while the women's group might explore biblical womanhood. Both will involve study sessions, prayer times, and fellowship opportunities.

Expanding Community Groups- To accommodate our growing congregation, we're introducing an additional community group (CG) luncheon on Sundays. This will bring our total to 3-4 groups, ensuring that everyone has space to join and engage in meaningful conversation and study after service. Each group will offer a unique theme or study focus, providing variety and choice for members to find the best fit for their spiritual growth.

Family Discipleship Routines – We are encouraging families to develop a routine of family discipleship, meeting with other families 1 to 2 times a month. These gatherings are designed to strengthen faith at home and build inter-family relationships within the church community. Activities may include shared meals, Bible study, service projects, and prayer times. This initiative aims to build a network of support among families, fostering a multi-generational discipleship culture.

Church Workdays – Our ongoing church refurbishment project has been a wonderful opportunity for fellowship and service. In 2024, we aim to complete the painting of the church as a community, inviting all members to participate in scheduled painting days. This initiative helps to instill a sense of ownership and pride in our place of worship while fostering a spirit of teamwork.

Plans & Goals for Mission

We have exciting plans lined up for the coming year at our church, focusing on community outreach, leadership development, and expanding our support programs.

Peñas Blancas Mission Trip – In October, our church will embark on a mission trip to Peñas Blancas, aiming to foster sustainable development and selfsufficiency in the local community. We intend to send a team of skilled craftsmen who will mentor and train residents in essential construction skills such as basic welding, electrical wiring, and plumbing. This project is a pivotal part of our church's commitment to global missions, focusing on equipping individuals with the knowledge and abilities needed to improve their living conditions and community infrastructure. Our mission will not only provide immediate assistance but also leave a lasting legacy by empowering the people of Penas Blancas to continue developing their skills long after our team has returned home.

World Changers Youth Mission Trip – The summer of 2024 marks another exciting chapter for our youth as they go on mission with World Changers. This mission trip is more than just a service opportunity; it is a formative experience that allows our young members to practice their faith in tangible ways. By engaging in community service projects, our youth will contribute directly to the well-being of communities while developing a deeper understanding of broader needs in our nation. They will take part in various hands-on tasks that are crucial to community growth, learning the value of hard work, team collaboration, and Christian service. This mission trip promises to not only impact the lives of those we serve but also shape the hearts and minds of our young participants.

Expanding CAYA Summer Lunch Program – The CAYA summer lunch program, which we host at Highlands, has seen a massive increase in reach and impact, calling those involved to look at broadening the scope even further. In response to this growth, CAYA is exploring partnerships with neighboring congregations like New Georgia Baptist Church (NGBC) to initiate a new branch of the program. This expansion would enable CAYA to provide nutritious meals to a larger number of families during the summer months when children are not receiving school lunches. Training NGBC volunteers in the operational aspects of the program is a key step toward ensuring the initiative's success and sustainability. Through this collaborative effort, CAYA aspires to address food insecurity more effectively and demonstrate the love of Christ through service.

Timothy Men xwLeadership Development – Under the guidance of Pastor Jody, we have launched the *Timothy Men* group, focusing on growing the next tier of leadership at HCC. This initiative mirrors the process used for elder development, aiming to nurture the talents of HCC men for effective service in their gifted areas. Plans & Goals for Resources & Relationships

At Highlands Community Church, we value participating in the broader community of believers available through participation and membership in like-minded organizations. Below is a list of our key ministry partnerships:

G3 Church Network – The goal of the G3 Church Network is to help educate, encourage, and equip local churches with sound biblical theology with the aim of engaging in joyful ministry together for the glory of God. G3 provides resources in the form of online articles, podcasts, expository preaching workshops, biblical worship workshops, and local church-based curriculum for Sunday school and small groups. In addition, G3 offers events such the national G3 conference, regional conferences, study cruises, and church history tours.

West Metro Baptist Association – The West Metro Baptist Association is a network of Baptist churches in Douglas, South Cobb, and Paulding Counties, west of Atlanta. They partner together to strengthen one another to be healthy churches, and then plant new churches as our communities grow. We work together to reach people with the message of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Founders Ministries – Founders believes that the biblical faith is inherently doctrinal, and we are therefore to be confessional in our convictions. Founders exists for the recovery of the gospel and the reformation of churches, and has been providing resources for churches since 1982 through conferences, books, The Sword & The Trowel Podcast, video documentaries, online articles found at founders.org, the quarterly Founders Journal, Bible studies, International church search, and the newly launched seminary level training program, the Institute of Public Theology.

CAYA Reconciliation Ministries - CAYA (Come As You Are) Reconciliation Ministries is a Christ-centered, non-profit charitable services outreach ministry serving the materially and spiritually poor both locally and internationally. CAYA currently provides the following services: Food Pantry, Emergency Food Assistance, financial assistance, financial counseling, bible study and counseling, clothing closet, furniture & household items, summer lunch program,

Hall's Living Library – Hall's Living Library is a beautiful collection of children's books, carefully selected and preserved, for families looking for quality, clean books for the children. Owned and operated by Mrs. Sandy Hall, and housed at Highlands Community Church, the library specializes in vintage, out-of-print children's books from the Golden Era of Children's Literature. Over 18,000 books collected over the past 50 years!

Plans & Goals for Fundraising

2024 Budget


In the spirit of transparency, we annually present our complete budget to the congregation for review and discussion. For the 2024 budget, we'd like to highlight the following key points:


- The mission trip to Peñas Blancas (item #7141) will rely on special fundraising efforts, and we will outline the target amount necessary to raise.
